## **Riots Rock Cahuenga Pass!**

Gang violence out of control!

A REPORT FROM THE **CPPOA PRESIDENT** 

wo "mini riots" in less than two months, plus five teenagers are shot on the Hollywood Freeway right at our front door. This is just the beginning. With every passing week, more and more examples of gang violence fill our neighborhood as a result of the MCA-Universal-CityWalk entertainment complex.

And what does the L.A. Sheriffs do with the gang members who act up? They eject them from the property of Universal, and dump them on...Cahuenga Boulevard West.

First it was noise. Then it was fights. Now it is bullets. And CityWalk is only 60% complete. Can we afford to believe MCA's promises, can we afford to wait until the rest of CityWalk is built?

MCA/Universal and the Burbank "Media District" are planapproved \$1.2 million of taxpayer money to prepare an Environmental Impact Report/Preliminary Design for the traffic "improvements" that will funnel traffic from the combined Burbank and Universal developments, onto Cahuenga Boulevard West.

The CPPOA worked in good faith for three years with the traffic consultants hired by MCA/Universal and the Burbank studios to try and develop a solution to our community's traffic problems. But

ning a combined development of 16 million square feet. This will force a complete disruption of all traffic through the Cahuenga Pass, and lead to the elimination of curb side parking on Cahuenga, which will destroy the neighborhood businesses.

In June the Metropolitan Transportation Authority Board in this most recent case, all our input was ignored.

MCA, the cities of Glendale and Burbank, the Los Angeles Department of Transportation, CalTrans, and the MTA Board of Directors all conspired to move this project forward over the wishes of the community.

Encouraging scavengers in the neighborhood only





## **Actions Speak Louder Than Words**


In 1991 the LA City Council passed the Ventura/Cahuenga Blvd. Corridor Specific Plan. Its purpose is to create guidlines and standards for improvements on all seventeen miles of Ventura/Cahuenga. We are part of the Studio City area, but here in the pass we have our own special issues to consider relating to MCA and Metrorail.

The first in a series of community workshops was held on September 21. You were sent a notice of this meeting by CPPOA. It was cosponsored by CPPOA, the Studio City Residents Association, the LA City Planning Dept., and the Plan Review Board of the Ventura/Cahuenga Boulevard Corridor Specific Plan. (If you want to know why government doesn't work, just look at how long they make the

names of their committees.)

If you didn't attend this meeting, decisions were made without you, for you, but by someone else!

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
